<p>Students will begin with an overview of the English Legal System, followed by a supervised court visit.</p> <p>The law relating to children as individuals; the duties of the local authority; adoption law and practice; leaving care.</p> <p>The impact of the ECHR and the Human Rights Act 1998 will be covered.</p> <p>The law relating to adults, with particular reference to vulnerable adults, mental health and disability.</p> <p>The law in relation to housing, including homelessness, immigration and judicial review.</p> <p>Criminal Justice and Youth Offending.</p>
