Module Aims

The aim of the module is to help students develop innovative ideas for film and TV content and to gain skills in transforming written ideas and concepts into moving image forms, alongside developing the ability to interpret and evaluate the cultural context of film and television through the production of a video essay.

Outline Syllabus

The syllabus explores ways in which stories are told on various screens. This includes literature and the Screen; Reading Films: case study; Watching Films: case study; Poetics; Stories and images; Adaptation (Robert Ray etc.); Graphic novels and the screen; Filmmakers and their methods; Photography and narration; Music and narration.

Students are assessed on their ability to develop and present a treatment, understanding the relationship between the written text and visual communication and the ability to plan and deliver a video essay.
